JOB OPPORTUNITY AT VANDERBILT

The Department of Radiology and Radiological Sciences of Vanderbilt University Medical Center is seeking applicants for two full time radiologist positions.

Breast Imaging Radiologist beginning as early as January 2021: This position would be on the Clinical Practice Track at the Assistant or Associate Professor level and would include coverage in the Vanderbilt Breast Center with all modalities as well as intervention. This position would take weekend ultrasound call approximately four times/year.

Radiologist in Women's Imaging beginning as early as January 2021: This position would be on the Clinical Practice Track at the Assistant or Associate Professor level and would include coverage in both the Vanderbilt Breast Center (60-70%) and in the Center for Women's Imaging (30-40%). Coverage in the Breast Center would include all modalities as well as intervention. Coverage for the Center for Women's Imaging would be limited to ultrasound. This position would take weekend ultrasound call approximately four times/year.

The Vanderbilt Breast Center is a full service NCCN and NAPBC affiliate and is an ACR Breast Imaging Center of Excellence. The Vanderbilt Breast Center operates as multidisciplinary clinic all located in one comprehensive site. The Center for Women's Imaging operates as a referral service for gynecologists and obstetricians from both the Medical Center and Nashville community.

Responsibilities include teaching (residents and breast imaging fellows) and participation in correlative conferences with the clinical services. Call responsibilities would be limited to general sonography call. Opportunities are available for research as well.

Candidates should have completed a breast or women's imaging fellowship and should be board certified or board eligible.

Thank you for entrusting me to kick off this conversation in ACR Engage. I just posted my feelings on the statement put out by ACR - which I think is in the right direction, but I wish had come down a bit more succinctly. Feel free to follow up. I don't post often on Engage as it can be a fraught space, but will follow up on this post. Below is what I wrote:

Dear ACR Family,

Please see below the ACR's statement on the current social unrest that our country is facing. I applaud the ACR for taking a stance on the systemic disenfranchisement of the black community. It is a step in the right direction and inline with the multitude of healthcare organizations starting to speak out on what is a public health crisis.

I am mostly an observer on this platform and hesitate to say more, but I feel like this needs to be said. I do take issue with the second to last paragraph. Yes - these events are tragic, but no - they are not shocking. I am not shocked because this is not the first time, and frankly I don't expect it to be the last. I am tired. I am exhausted. I am dismayed. I am sad. I am angry.... I am scared...but, not shocked. The remainder of this paragraph goes on to say that, "...we still have the opportunity to address inequality in healthcare and social justice in disparity..." Instead of seeing the opportunity, I would like to see the ACR seize the opportunity and make a commitment to leverage our advocacy network to do so.

Why is this so important to me?

Because I run in my mostly white neighborhood several days per week and my clothes have become increasingly neon so I am unmistakably on a jog. I am one Amazon package away from a sweat band.

Because I changed all of my house locks to keypads. Not because I don't want the inconvenience of a key, but because the last time I was locked out of my house one of my neighbors did not offer help. Instead they called the police - who thankfully was a "good apple". I need to know that when it happens to my brother, father, nephew and cousins, they have codes because they may not get the same reprieve I did.

Because my heart rate goes from 65 to 200 when I am driving and a police car comes up behind me. Not because I have done anything wrong, but because I am conditioned to be terrified of that type of authority.

Because black people live under chronic stress which is directly related to rampant underlying chronic illness. Because black women are 2.5 times more likely to die in child birth when compared to white women - regardless of socioeconomic status. Because as a physician I have an obligation to leverage my voice and help those in need...and I can only hope that you do to.

This is not a black problem. This is an American problem. This hurts all of us, even if you don't feel it as acutely as I do. This cannot even begin to be solved until those with power leverage it in ally-ship to help a community whose necks are crushed under the knee of aggressive, unnecessary, authority both literally and figuratively. The ACR can be an ally.

Afterwards, she completed a residency in Diagnostic Radiology and Nuclear Medicine at UMASS Medical Center in Worcester, Massachusetts before relocating to the Washington, DC area for a fellowship in Cross-Sectional Body Imaging at Georgetown University Hospital. With a background steeped in Trauma and Emergency Imaging, Krystal started her career as an Assistant Professor at the University of Maryland Shock Trauma Center in Baltimore, Maryland. There she developed research interests in imaging cardiac trauma and the use of dual-energy CT in the emergent setting. In August 2017, Krystal transitioned to Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia as the Director of Critical Event Preparedness and Response for the department of Radiology and the Clinical Site Director of Emergency and Trauma Imaging at Grady Memorial Hospital, Atlanta's only level 1 trauma center. Krystal was awarded the Emory Department of Radiology Outstanding Service (Junior Faculty) Award in 2018. Outside of the hospital, Krystal spends her time gardening and going on bike rides with her family.

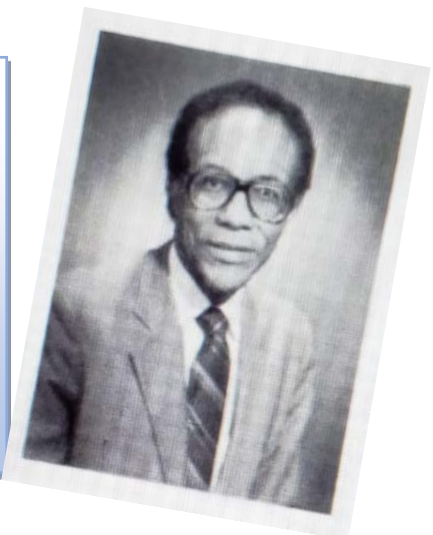
