Reflecting on the Life of Dr. Kathleen Gordon

On a lovely spring day in May 1945, in the town of Beaumont, Texas, a baby girl was born to the union of Mrs. Mildred Portis Gordon and Mr. Warren Robert Swartz Gordon. They were happy to welcome their fourth child and second daughter, whom they named Mary Kathleen Gordon.

Mary Kathleen was raised in the loving home of her mother along with brothers, Warren and Wayne, and sister, Nancy. The siblings were also very close with their maternal grandmother, Mrs. Mary Elizabeth Portis, who lived down the road in Orange, Texas, which is where Mary Kathleen attended St. Theresa Catholic School for her first two years of education. From a young child she was always super smart, inquisitive, extroverted, friendly, and loved learning new things with a spirited sense of adventure. When she saw an injustice, in her young mind, she needed to make it right - and growing up in the segregated south, there were always many things that were unfair and needed to be changed.

Mary Kathleen breezed through her school years, always excelling and active in extracurricular activities. In her high school class, there were six girls named Mary, so one day she announced that she wanted to be called "Kathleen" to differentiate herself from the other five girls. From that day on, family had to remember not to call her "Mary" anymore, or you would quickly be corrected.

One of her greatest life influencers was her mother. Mrs. Gordon, a long-time English and Music teacher in the Beaumont Independent School District, instilled in her children respect for others, love of family, love of God, an honest effort to maximize achievements, and courage to aspire as high as your educational abilities could carry you. She made sure that excellence was the primary goal no matter the subject. In high school, Kathleen played flute in the band, she was in the choir, the National Honor Society, Student Council, and a majorette, and she was the state "Number Sense" champion in Math. She was Valedictorian of the Charlton Pollard High School Class of 1962 and went on to attend Lamar College in Beaumont, along with her siblings, Wayne and Nancy.

Kathleen transferred to the University of Texas at Austin where she continued her pursuit of academic excellence while also becoming a member of the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. She graduated in 1967 with a B.A. degree in Zoology. After graduation, she began working at IBM in Austin and they sent her to Washington, DC on an assignment at the IRS. She loved this new city and decided to make it her home. She later worked at the Urban Institute, a Washington "think tank," before pursuing her life-long love of medicine. She later worked at the Urban Institute, a Medical School Dean, took the MCAT exam, and enrolled in the Howard University College of Medicine. She received a Doctor of Medicine (MD) degree in 1975 and then began her career as a Radiologist.

During her Howard tenure, she was Chief Resident in Radiology at Howard University Hospital and was an Assistant Professor in the College of Medicine. Kathleen received three Medicine Research and Clinical Presentation Awards and the "Dr. Daniel Hale Williams Award" as Most Outstanding Resident at Howard University Hospital. She was the author of three articles published in National Radiological Journals.

As a Board-Certified Radiologist, Kathleen worked in her field for 48 years. Some of her professional experiences included Associate Clinical Professor of Radiology at George Washington University, President of the Washington Metropolitan Chapter of the American College of Radiology (ACR), and President of the Radiology Section of the National Medical Association (NMA), the premier organization for over 50,000 African American physicians. Kathleen served on the Executive Board of the Washington DC Medical Society, and in 1991, she was one of the first two Black female Radiologists inducted as a Fellow of the American College of Radiology (FACR), a prestigious honor that is awarded to only fifteen percent of ACR members by the Board of Chancellors.

Her work experiences included years-long company partnership in Diagnostic Radiology & Ultrasound, and later holding staff positions at Washington Adventist Hospital, George Washington Hospital, Fort Washington Hospital, KMH Radiology, Nanticoke Health Services, University of Maryland Shore Medical Center at Easton, Medstar St. Mary's Hospital, Winchester Medical Center, University of Maryland Capital Region Health, and Charles Medical Center. She helped to train, mentor, and encourage many of the young Radiology Technologists to continue and excel in their medical careers.

Kathleen was a staunch advocate for women's health and was passionate in promoting breast cancer awareness. She was often invited to speak to organizations on women's issues and in 1989 received one of the first "Betty Ford, DC American Cancer Society Breast Cancer Awareness Awards." She served for several years on the advisory board of the "Sisters Network of Baltimore," a national network dedicated to improving the lives of African American breast cancer survivors. She saved many lives through the thousands of radiology studies she performed, while continuously encouraging women (and men) to get their regular mammography examinations.

In 1969, Kathleen married the late Thomas J. Cantwell, and to that union was born a daughter, Jennifer Beth Cantwell. She also gave birth to one son, John Ethan Press, born in 1961. She later married Cecil Herd and was a bonus mother to his daughters, Courtney Phillip and Candyce Herd. She took great pride in being a loving mother to her children and doting grandmother to her six beautiful grandchildren.

From her early days attending mass and teaching CCD classes at Blessed Sacrament Church in Beaumont, Kathleen grounded herself in her faith journey. Thirty-three years ago, she became a member of the St. Augustine Catholic Church community and immediately joined the Gospel Choir. The spirituality and camaraderie of the choir family meant a lot to Kathleen, as her love of music gave her many fulfilling years of singing joyful praises to the Lord. She traveled with the choir as they evangelized in cities and towns across the country, as well as in Italy, France, Germany, and Costa Rica. She gave her all as she engaged in this ministry, and she received much love and fellowship in return.

Kathleen lived a full life engaging in world travel and adventures in places such as the Caribbean, Mexico, Egypt, South Africa, Senegal, and Ghana. With her extroverted and friendly personality, she developed many long-lasting friendships along her life's journey. If there was a Charlton Pollard Alumni Reunion, Kathleen was there. Just this past July, she traveled to Beaumont for the latest school reunion where she was also present as a guest of honor. At the 2014 school reunion, she was inducted into the "Bulldog Hall of Fame" as an outstanding and accomplished CP Alumnus. She and her class members of 1962 never stopped being in touch as they shared life-long friendships and milestone family events. The same is true with her Howard University Medical School classmates – they kept in contact and enjoyed many reunions and special events together.

Family was of utmost importance to Kathleen. She was always actively involved in family activities – ready to help in any way that was needed. In 2013, she married Keith Robinson in a lovely ceremony "beside the still waters" of the NabsC creek River. Keith and Kathleen loved to entertain, and hosted birthdway and holiday gatherings, cookouts, pool parties, dinner parties, and any special occasion worthy of a celebratory get-together. Her lamb lollipops on the grill were always a hit, and disappeared in a flash whenever they were served. The Robinsons were warmly embraced by their wonderful neighbors in the Prospect Bay Community in Grasonville, MD. They all spent a lot of time together creating countless memories at the Resort Club and during neighborhood activities, including talent shows, costume parties, boat rides, fishing, and other special themed events.

Kathleen had an affinity for sunrises, sunsets, and bodies of water, and often you would find her taking up residence on or near a creek, river, ocean and most recently, the Chesapeake Bay. She and Keith would often venture out in the evenings to witness the sunset and she would excitedly take prictures (the program cover background being one of them) and marvel in the beauty of the everchanging landscape of the painted sky. The simple things in life brought her so much joy and peace, and she was always inspired to spread love, kindness, and laughter (the one liners and quips were endless) with everyones he encountered. She had a heart of gold, a soul of compassion, and was overly generous when she saw that you were in need. To have known her truly is to love her.

Kathleen is lovingly missed by her husband, Keith Robinson of Grasonville, MD; her children, Jennifer Cantwell Wood of Chapel Hill, NC and John Ethan Press [Tanya] of Frederick, MD; and her son-in-law, James Wood of Chapel Hill, NC. She leaves to cherish her legacy six grandchildren: Liam and Jack Wood; and Chelsea, Derrick, Hazel and Madeline Press. Her parents and brother Wayne predeceased her, but she will be dearly missed by her brother, Warren (Donna) Gordon of Upper Marlboro, MD; and sisters, Nancy Gordon of Laurel, MD, and Carolyn Gordon of Houston, TX. There are many nieces, nephews, cousins, and countless co-workers, neighbors, parishioners, and friends who love Kathleen and will forever treasure her memories. Thank you all for being a special part of her life.
